"Living Like You And Your Brothers Are At Peace With God" (Part 1) 2 Samuel 3:20-30

"To be Christian means to forgive the inexcusable, because God has forgiven the inexcusable in you."

"You are nothing better than deceitful hypocrites if you harbor in your minds a single unforgiving thought. There are some sins which may be in the heart, and yet you may be saved. But you cannot be saved unless you are forgiving. If we do not choose to forgive, we choose to be damned." (C.H. Spurgeon)

- Abner went in PEACE: (2 Samuel 3:20-21)
 - o If David and Abner are at PEACE then everyone under their authority is at peace with one another. "Therefore, since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ" (Romans 5:1). "Finally, all of you, have unity of mind, sympathy, brotherly love, a tender heart, and a humble mind. Do not repay evil for evil or reviling for reviling, but on the contrary, bless, for TO THIS, you were called, that you may obtain a blessing" (1 Peter 3:8-9).
 - What kind of CAPACITY do we have in Christ for forgiveness, love, and extending grace?
 - Forgiveness (Luke 17:3-4); Love (Luke 6:32-36); Grace (Ephesians 4:32); *We must focus on why we CAN, not why we CAN'T.*
- Joab questions David being at PEACE with Abner: (2 Samuel 3:22-25)
 - Joab assumed the worst in Abner because of the condition of his heart. He found the forgiving of Abner to be unacceptable. "Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things." (1 Corinthians 13:7; cf. Luke 15:25-32)
 - Joab may have had many reasons for his anger with David:
 - 1) The bitterness in his heart over the death of his brother.
 - 2) The fear of losing his position as commander to Abner.
 - 3) His genuine desire to protect David from his enemies. (1 Samuel 26:15-16)
- Joab refuses to be at PEACE with Abner: (2 Samuel 3:26-30)
 - The very deception that Joab accused Abner of was what he was committing. "For they (Pharisees) preach, but do not practice. They tie up heavy burdens, hard to bear, and lay them on people's shoulders, but they themselves are not willing to move them with their finger."

 (Matthew 23:3b-4; cf. Proverbs 26:23-26)
 - o Abner killed Asahel in self-defense and Joab murdered Abner in cold blood.
 - O David made sure publicly that he didn't approve of this sin that was committed by Joab. We must never call evil good and good evil (Isaiah 5:20; cf. 1 Corinthians 5:9-13).
