"John the Baptist: What Do I Do In Weakness/Doubt?" (Part 4)

Luke 7:18-35; Matthew 11:1-6

"There is a great difference between **doubt** and **unbelief**. Doubt is a matter of **the mind** and unbelief is a matter of **the heart**. Doubt **draws us** to Jesus for truth. Unbelief **keeps us** from going to Jesus for truth. Doubt wants **cured** and unbelief wants **to stay sick**."

- Three tests that can lead us to a higher Delight or Doubt in Christ if handled Biblically:
  - Hardship, Suffering, or Pain: "So we do not lose heart. Though our outer self is wasting away, our inner self is being renewed day by day. For this light momentary affliction is preparing for us an eternal weight of glory beyond all comparison." (2 Corinthians 4:16-17)
  - A Frustration of Our Lack of Knowledge About Christ: "But grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. To Him be the glory both now and to the day of eternity. Amen." (2 Peter 3:18)
  - An Expectation of Harshness, Instead of Compassion and Mercy, From God: "Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need." (Hebrews 4:16)
- John's Question: (Luke 7:18-23)
  - John was confused, defeated in prison, and doubting. When he was in this condition he went to Jesus, he didn't sit in unbelief.
  - Jesus responded to John's doubt with Scripture, namely, a fulfillment of Scripture (Isaiah 35:5-6; 61:1). This gives us a means to deal with doubt, "What does the Bible say?" (Psalm 119:67-68,71-72)
  - "Blessed is the one who is not offended by Me.": Despite your circumstance, will you continue to believe? Will you have faith and trust?
- Jesus' Testimony of John: (Luke 7:24-28)
  - Jesus confirms John's message, his firm and unshakeable faith, and his calling. But that doesn't mean that John has no weaknesses, he's a man. Jesus again uses Scripture, not to just validate that He is the Messiah, but that John was His forerunner (Malachi 3:1).
  - "Yet the one who is least in the kingdom of God is greater than he.": We, as New Covenant believers (Ezekiel 36:26-27), have privileges that no Old Testament Saints, including John, never had.
    - 1) The full revelation of God's Word. 2) The indwelling Holy Spirit. 3) A greater understanding of eternity. 4) The example of Jesus.
- Jesus' Rebuke of Israel: (Luke 7:29-35)
  - <u>Two Groups:</u> A group that accepted John's message and repented and a group that saw no need of repentance, they were self-righteous.
  - <u>Two Messages:</u> We need the message of the wickedness of sin, mourning, and need of repentance. We also need the message of grace and mercy, forgiveness, rejoicing, and encouragement.
  - "Yet wisdom is justified by all her children.": There are two kinds of children; children of wisdom and children of folly. People who believe or people who do not believe. Our lives prove whose children we are!
