"Humility Before God Leads to Zeal Before Man" 2 Samuel 6:14-23

Pride: A feeling of deep pleasure or satisfaction derived from someone's own achievements. **Humility:** A feeling of deep pleasure or satisfaction derived from Christ's achievements. "So that, as it is written, 'Let the one who boasts, boast in the Lord." (1 Corinthians 1:31)

"When pride comes, then comes disgrace, but with the humble is wisdom" (Proverbs 11:2). "Before destruction a man's heart is haughty, but humility comes before honor" (Proverbs 18:12). "One's pride will bring him low, but he who is lowly in spirit will obtain honor" (Proverbs 29:23). "Humble yourselves before the Lord, and He will exalt you" (James 4:10).

- Humble Worship Before God: (2 Samuel 6:14-19)
 - There was an ephod that was worn by the High Priest (Exodus 28:6-8), and there was an ephod that was worn by anyone engaged in religious service (1 Samuel 22:18). David was humbling himself with the priesthood in the service of God, not exalting himself above the worship of God...."For a day in Your courts is better than a thousand elsewhere. I would rather be a doorkeeper in the house of my God than dwell in the tents of wickedness." (Psalm 84:10)
 - There are many acts of worship before God in the Bible. The actions are not prescriptive, but instead are reflective of the heart of the worshiper.
 - "David *danced* before the LORD with all his might....*leaping* and dancing." (2 Samuel 6:14,16)
 - "The house of Israel brought up the ark of the LORD with *shouting* and with the *sound of the horn."* (2 Samuel 6:15)
 - "Clap your hands, all peoples! Shout to God with loud songs of joy!" (Psalm 47:1)
 - "All the people answered, 'Amen, Amen,' lifting up their hands. And they bowed their heads and worshiped the LORD with their faces to the ground." (Nehemiah 8:6)
 - Solomon "knelt with *hands outstretched toward heaven."* (1 Kings 8:54)
 - Israel *fasted* and *wept* before the LORD. (Judges 20:26)
 - "Be *silent*, all flesh, before the LORD." (Zechariah 2:13)
- Proud Hearts Before Men: (2 Samuel 6:20-23)
 - "Then let us bring again the ark of our God to us, for we did not seek it in the days of Saul." (1 Chronicles 13:3)
 - Michal went out to meet David and said, "The king of Israel has embarrassed himself today by acting like a commoner, by dancing like women dance, and by dressing like a priest not like a king. It is a vile thing to humiliate yourself before the people like this." (1 Chronicles 15:27-28; 1 Samuel 18:6; Exodus 15:20; 1 Samuel 15:12)
 - David said to Michal, "It was God who replaced your father with me because your father was proud. In light of that, I will give all glory to God and keep none for myself. I will go as low as I need to go to glorify God." (1 Samuel 16:11; 1 Samuel 18:23; 1 Samuel 24:14; 2 Samuel 7:18)
