- Credible Eyewitnesses (Luke 1:3-4)
 - Simeon was righteous and devout (Luke 1:6). He was waiting on the consolation of Israel (Personal Salvation and National Salvation by the Messianic Reign). The Holy Spirit was upon him (John 14:17). He would not see death until he had seen the Messiah (Luke 2:29-32).
 - Anna was a prophetess and was committed to praying and fasting at the Temple. She was used as an instrument by God to tell true believers that the Messiah had come, namely, those that were waiting for the redemption of Jerusalem (the fulfillment of the New Covenant – Jeremiah 32:37-41).
- Faith and Works (Leviticus 12:1-8)
 - Circumcision: It was commanded that when a child was 8 days old he would be circumcised (Genesis 17:9-14; Leviticus 12:3).
 - The Purification: A woman was ceremonially unclean after giving birth. This was to remind the
 people that everyone is born into sin. Both the mother and the child needed to be saved from
 their sins.
 - Present Him to the Lord: Every firstborn male is given to the Lord and able to be redeemed by purchasing them back from the Lord (Exodus 13:1-16; Numbers 3:12-13; 18:15-24)
 - Sacrifices: She would be made ceremonially clean by the burnt offering (renewed relationship with God) and the sin offering (admittance of guilt before God) made by the Priest (Leviticus 12:1-8).
- The Purpose of Israel: (Deuteronomy 7:6-11)
 - The Messiah would come from a Nation. (Genesis 12:1-3)
 - The Messiah would be rejected by a Nation. (Isaiah 8:14-15; 53:3)
 - The Messiah would rule from a Nation. (Isaiah 9:6-7)
 - The world would understand about Yahweh and The Messiah by the practices of a Nation.
 (Hebrews 8-10)
 - The Word of God came from a Nation. (Romans 3:1-2)
