Counter-Cultural Christianity Philippians 1:27-30

"We must not forget that the gospel of Christ is holy. It never excuses sin: it pardons it, but only through an atonement. If our life is to resemble the gospel, we must shun, not merely the grosser vices, but everything that would hinder our perfect conformity to Christ" -Charles Spurgeon

In recent years, the Church and our Culture have been *mingling* together. This has had two major effects:

- 1. You have a higher chance for those who are not Christians to be deceived into thinking they are. These are *nominal Christians* (Christians in name only) who identify with certain aspects of Christianity but neglect the spiritual requirements of **repentance**, **faith** and **submission** to Christ.
- The Church is watered down by the culture. Instead of preaching the whole counsel
 of God (Acts 20:27) the Church preaches an imbalanced view of scripture in order to
 accommodate the Culture.

The way we live as Christians, and the Church as a whole, should be *clear* to the culture around us that they are lost and headed for destruction (vs. 28). The fact that we have a *heavenly citizenship* should be evident in our lives (Phil 3:20). Living a life worthy of the Gospel of Christ is the goal. (Vs. 27). How do we accomplish this?

- **1. Stand Firm** Christians are engaged in a conflict. (Vs. 29-30). We are to stand *for* God and *against* Satan (1 Pet 5:8-9). We are to stand *for* truth and *against* falsehood (3 John 1:4). We are to stand *for* righteousness and *against* wickedness (Heb 1:9)
- This is in the big decisions as well as the small decisions (1 Cor 10:31)
- 2. In One Spirit, in One Mind, Striving Side by Side This is our doctrine we stand on and our disposition toward one another. We should be unified in our attitudes and in what we believe! (Ecc 4:12, Phil 4:1-3)
- 3. Not to Be Frightened We are sure to meet opposition in our Christian walks (2 Tim 3:12) But our example of faith, in the face of opposition, along with presenting the gospel, is a powerful witness to those who are lost around us (Acts 7:51-60) We know the outcome of the conflict we are engaged in. It ends with our salvation (vs. 28) Our suffering is temporary, as we are sojourners here (1 Pet 2:11) The suffering for those who die in their sins is eternal. It ends with their destruction (vs. 28)

Vs. 30 Paul did not grow discouraged in the conflict he was engaged in. He still felt the weight of sorrow and suffering, but God gave him joy in the midst of it.
