True and Lasting Comfort 2 Corinthians 1:3-5

"Sorrow is that inheritance to which every man is born; even truly godly people, as long as they continue in this Valley of Tears, will, at a greater or smaller distance, be followed by two **inseparable attendants**: sorrow and sighing" - Charles Spurgeon

God has always been the God of comfort. (Psalm 23:4, 71:21) Both OT saints and NT saints have found their comfort in God.

• God is not redundant. He would not be the God of *comfort* if mankind never experienced affliction.

The reality is, mankind is going to experience affliction. We live in a fallen and broken world. **Job 5:6-7** "For affliction does not come from the dust, nor does trouble sprout from the ground, but man is born to trouble as the sparks fly upward"

Affliction is *anything that causes pain or suffering*, and it has the ability to affect us from the **past**, from our **present** daily struggles, and things we worry about in the **future**. So how do we deal with affliction?

Comfort from Daily Afflictions: (Vs. 3-4)The Lord comforts us in *all* our afflictions. Without exception.

The Holy Spirit is called the **Paraclete**: The Comforter (John 14:16, 16:7) We are able to call upon Him at all times through prayer.

- His promises are there for us to find comfort in. (Psalm 119:49-50)
- He supplies every one of our needs (Phil 4:19)

God Comforts Us Through Others (Vs. 4-6) The comfort we receive from God will encourage others to do the same.

- The Lord used Paul for others to find comfort and confidence in God. (Phil 1:12-14)
- God is training us to be comforters through affliction
- Titus comforted Paul by simply being there for him, on top of the good news Titus brought him. (2 Cor 7:5-7)

Comfort in Our Salvation

The gospel produces a comfort for the soul knowing that the guilt and penalty of our sin has been completely taken care of by the work of Jesus Christ.

- The weight of sin is meant to afflict us, to crush us. This shows us our need for a Savior (Acts 2:37)
- The Gospel is the remedy for a sin-afflicted soul. (Acts 2:38-41) and brings great joy! (Vs. 42, 46-47)
- We have eternal hope and comfort through the Gospel (2 Thes 2:16-17)
- Christ's sacrifice was an affliction that He took in our place. We will never have to experience it. This was a "once for all" sacrifice that cannot and will not be repeated (Heb 10:10)
