"Beloved, never avenge yourselves, but leave it to the wrath of God, for it is written, 'Vengeance is Mine, I will repay, says the Lord." (Romans 12:19; cf. Deuteronomy 32:35; Nahum 1:2-3a)

## "Better is open rebuke than hidden love." (Proverbs 27:5)

- The Plan (2 Samuel 13:23-27)
  - "After two full years":
    - Tamar has been a desolate woman in Absalom's house, with no action taken for Amnon's crime. (2 Samuel 14:27)
    - David had come to peace over the rape of Tamar.
    - Absalom had been fueling his hatred for Amnon. (2 Samuel 13:32)
    - Jonadab had possibly known about this the whole time without mentioning it to anyone.
      (2 Samuel 13:32)
  - "All the king's sons":
    - Eight times in our text this phrase is used. It is pointing to the fact that if all of David's sons died, then he would be without an heir to his throne (2 Samuel 7:12-17).
  - The King has changed....
    - David has lost his love for justice (2 Samuel 8:15) and David has lost his zeal to glorify Yahweh (2 Samuel 8:11-14).
- The Murder (2 Samuel 13:28-33)
  - Absalom has someone else do his "dirty work".
    - Just like his father, Absalom had someone else take the life of his target (2 Samuel 12:9).
      - *"Revenge makes a man equally guilty with his enemy, but in letting God avenge, he is superior to his enemy."*
  - The exaggeration of "bad news".
    - We have a natural disposition to exaggerate the news, especially bad news (2 Samuel 1:6-10).
  - Jonadab strikes again....
    - Jonadab has no loyalty to anyone. He is nothing more than a creative troublemaker who likes seeing lives destroyed (2 Samuel 13:3).
- The Escape (2 Samuel 13:34-39)
  - David loses two sons....
    - David lost Amnon when Absalom murdered him and he lost Absalom when he ran away to his grandfather. Both of these losses were a result of David not handling his sons as a father or a king (1 Samuel 3:13).
  - Sin destroys families....
