## "Only Christ Can Bring Peace" (Part 1) 2 Samuel 19:1-15

"Therefore, since we have been justified by faith, we have **PEACE** with God through our Lord Jesus Christ." (Romans 5:1)

"Of the increase of His government and of **PEACE** there will be no end, on the throne of David and over His kingdom, to establish it and to uphold it with justice and righteousness from this time forth and forevermore.

The zeal of the LORD of hosts will do this." (Isaiah 9:7)

- (2 Samuel 19:1-4) The Connection Between Leadership and Their People.
  - "So the **victory** that day was turned into **mourning** for all the people...." (cf. 1 Samuel 8:5-7)
    - God has delivered David from his enemies and given justice to all those who had rebelled against the kingdom. (cf. 2 Samuel 18:28,31)
  - "And the people entered the city that day as those who had fled in battle...."
    - "If both you and the king who reigns over you will follow the LORD your God, it will be well." (1 Samuel 12:14b)
    - "For *the people* should seek instruction from *his (the priests) mouth*....But you have turned aside from the way. You have caused many to stumble by your instruction." (Malachi 2:7-8)
    - "And *many will follow* their (false teachers) sensuality, and because of them the way of truth will be blasphemed." (2 Peter 2:2)
    - "Obey your leaders and submit to them, for they are keeping watch over your souls, as those who will have to give an account. Let them do this with joy and not with groaning, for that would be of no advantage to you." (Hebrews 13:17)
- (2 Samuel 19:5-7) Joab's Speech.
  - "You have today covered with shame the faces of your servants."
  - "Your servants have saved you and your family's life."
  - o "You love those who hate you and hate those who love you."
  - o "You have made it clear that your servants are nothing to you."
  - "Arise, go and speak kindly to your servants."
- (2 Samuel 19:8-15) David's Attempt at Peace.
  - Things have changed since 2 Samuel 5:1-4. A Kingdom that was centered on God and His will, was now centered on sin, confusion, and rebellion.
    - David took his seat in the gate.
    - David included Zadok and Abiathar in his peace making efforts.
    - David focused on what unified them, not what divided them.
    - David placed Amasa as the commander of the army.
      - "And he swayed the heart of all the men of Judah as one man...."
