"Jesus is Better: The Joy of Critical Thinking" (Part 1) Luke 6:20-26

"There is a kind of poverty, hunger, weeping, and being hated and reviled, that is a result of **being blessed** by Jesus. There is also a kind of wealth, fullness, laughter, and acceptance, that is **a judgment** from God."

"Being satisfied, being content, or desiring this world **more** than you desire Christ, is a judgment from God. If

Jesus is better, then to not see that is truly spiritual blindness."

• Dissecting the Text:

- <u>Blessed:</u> To receive grace; to experience gain; to be fortunate; to be happy; to have reason to celebrate; to receive abundance; to receive favor from God; to be well off; or to be satisfied.
- <u>Woe:</u> To experience grief; to experience affliction; to be wretched; to be in danger or in trouble;
 to be under judgment; to be under God's wrath.
- Both the *blessings* and the woes are connected with the worth of Jesus or lack thereof; "On account of the Son of Man!"
- Naturally we do not associate blessings with the description of Luke 6:20-22 and we naturally
 associate blessings with the description of Luke 6:23-26.
 - "The natural person does not accept the things of the Spirit of God, for they are *folly to him*, and he is not able to understand them because they are spiritually discerned." (1 Corinthians 2:14)
- Naturally we want temporal reward and have little to no interest in eternal realities; "your reward
 is great in heaven" or "you have received your consolation or reward".
 - "He considered the reproach of Christ *greater wealth* than the treasures of Egypt, for he was looking to *the reward*." (Hebrews 11:26)
- o Look at the response to the realities of Luke 6:20-23 "Rejoice in that day, and leap for joy...."
 - "For in a severe test of affliction, their abundance of joy and their extreme poverty have overflowed in a wealth of generosity on their part." (2 Corinthians 8:2)
- The consequence of living for now; this world or temporal satisfaction....
 - No reward for anything done in this life, an eternal hungering; and an eternal mourning and weeping. These are loving warnings of the danger of not valuing Christ above everything else (cf. Matthew 13:49-50; Matthew 25:41,46; 2 Thessalonians 1:6-9).
